

Accreditation opened for German-Baltic youth conference
Europe's young future "Made in Tallinn"

From the 1st - 3rd of May, the German-Baltic Youth Office will bring together more than 150 young people from four countries in Tallinn. Those future conferences are the largest project for networking between young people from Germany and the Baltic States. Together, the participants from Germany, Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania will be developing new approaches to politics under the motto "How do we want Europe to act?".

In Tallinn, they will discuss important current topics such as data sovereignty, genetic engineering and digital participation. Within the clusters, the participants will meet with different experts from politics, business and media. Figures, such as the American computer scientist Gregory Wheeler, member of the Bundestag Elisabeth Motschmann and genetic technologist Edo Kapetanovic have already confirmed their participation. After the conference, the participants will present their results to the ministries and parliaments of the four countries as well as to representatives of the European Union.

The working languages of the conference are German and English. The event will take place in the National Library of Estonia (Tõnismägi 2, 10122 Tallinn). It is promoted by the German Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Participation is free of charge. Press accreditation is now open until the 17th of April 2020.
