

Europe's youth building bridges through the Internet

German and Baltic youngsters will discuss EU's fate in times of Corona

The German-Baltic Youth Organization is looking for clever ideas for Europe: Young people from the Baltic States and Germany will be developing answers to urgent questions of the future. In view of the pandemic situation, the project is moving onto the internet: From June to September, discussions with experts from science and society will take place each month. The corona pandemic will also play an important role. Parallel to the event, the participants will discuss new solution strategies.

On 3rd of June at 6:30 pm (GMT +2; 7:30 pm Baltic time) Carsten Brzeski, chief economist for the euro zone and global head of research at ING Bank, will open the first discussion of the project. His talk "Europe under Corona: Again (not so much) united in diversity" addresses the topic, whether the current situation rather poses a danger or an opportunity for the current understanding of the European Union. The conversation will be held on the platform Zoom. The working language of the first meeting is German. Registration is opened at www.dbjw.de.

The German-Baltic Youth Service is committed to creating opportunities for exchange between young adults from Germany, the Baltic States and Russia. Due to the current situation, the scheduled German-Baltic conference in Tallinn had to be cancelled. Its program will take place in Vilnius in October 2020, where also the results of the digital conference will play an important role.
